





Implementation areas and key SO4 outputs as of December 2022



Jonglei State, South Sudan

62,115 people participating in conflict prevention activities (EUTF 4.3) in the South Sudanese state that was central to the outbreak of the country's civil war in December 2013 as a result of armed political opposition and ethnic militias.¹ Since then, Jonglei has experienced high levels of intercommunal violence and violence perpetrated by ethnic militias.ii

Khartoum State, Sudan

479 people trained on governance and conflict prevention (EUTF 4.2), in a state that experienced 569 conflict-related events (such as armed attacks and violent demonstrations). Viii

Togdheer Region, Somalia

1,477 people trained on governance and conflict prevention (EUTF 4.2), of whom 49% were trained on improved governance, in a region experiencing a protracted humanitarian crisis. Togdheer Region, which is part of Somaliland State, also struggled with growing tensions over delayed elections in 2022. vii

Northern Region, Uganda

21 strategies and laws developed (EUTF 4.6), including twelve on education and legal rights for refugees in response to the more than 700,000 refugees hosted in the regionⁱⁱⁱ, as well as seven policies on natural resource management to address environmental concerns associated with the refugee influx.^{iv}

Mandera County, Kenya

18,256 people participating in conflict prevention activities (EUTF 4.3) in a county that is exposed to frequent attacks by Al Shabaab, with at least 100 armed clashes, abductions, explosions and other events involving the group reported between 2020 and 2022.*

SNNP Region, Ethiopia

prevention activities (EUTF 4.3) in a region prone to intercommunal violence that displaced around 120,000 people between the end of 2020 and early 2021.vi


Number of SO4 priority projects per region²



Increase in S1 2019 (8,584)

The Security and Rule of Law programme (Somalia), SPRS-NU DRC project (Uganda) and Cross-Border programme (regional), which contributed to 19%, 15% and 12% of all reported results respectively, implemented key conflict prevention activities for social cohesion and security actors in S1 2019.

Drop throughout 2020 (S1: 3,173 and S2: 3.159)

The two smallest semester outputs were reported in 2020, as projects reached fewer people with governance and conflict prevention trainings during the COVID-19 pandemic, and one of the key contributing projects, SPRS-NU DRC, slowed down activities as it came to an end in September 2020.

Increase in S2 2022 (10,201)

SUPREME JLOS MoJCA began implementation at the end of 2021 and reached the largest number of people trained by a project in a single semester in S2 2022 by training more than 4,000 individuals, mostly justice and ministry officials and community policing officers, in Uganda.

Increase in S1 2020 (145,072) followed by a drop in S2 2020 (17,833)

At the height of its implementation, the first phase of the **Cross-Border** programme together with Self-reliance of South **Sudanese refugees in DRC**, reached 96% of individuals participating in conflict prevention activities in S1 2020.

Largest semester output reported to date in S2 2021 (505,841)

Kenya-EU partnership NCTC's mass awareness radio and online campaigns reached more than 400,000 Kenyans across the country.

Drop in S1 2022 (58,990) followed by an increase in S2 2022 (303,919)

Kenya-EU partnership NCTC reported the second-largest project output ever in S2 2022 before ending in December. The project reached 46% of all conflict prevention activity participants reported to date, while 69 other projects have also contributed to conflict prevention up to December 2022.

Increase in S2 2019 (127)

Throughout the EUTF, most strategies and laws have been reported in Somalia. **RESTORE 2 WV** (Somalia), responsible for 11% of all laws and strategies supported to date, began implementation in 2019 and, along with seven other projects, contributed to 77 new strategies or plans developed on legal assistance and other topics in Somalia in S2 2019.

Increase in S2 2021 (161)

52 2021 accounts for the largest semester output ever reported, thanks to 104 policies supported or developed in South Sudan through six projects. Key to this was South **Sudan Women Empowerment Dorcas**, which began implementation in S1 2021, and supported the development of 78 community action plans on gender the following semester.
