

EU Trust Fund for Africa Support to Libya

Through the Emergency Trust Fund for Africa the European Union is actively working to provide protection, assistance and alternatives to migrants, refugees and internally displaced people in Libya. Help is being provided for migrants at disembarkation points, inside and outside detention centres or in host communities by IOM and UNHCR. Help provided includes for example medical assistance, or the distribution of basic items and hygiene kits. Support is also aimed at stabilisation of host communities, through socio-economic development at municipal level and to better integrate migrants, internally displaced people and returnees. All projects are implemented by international partners on the ground, such as the UN agencies or by EU member states.

PROGRAMMES IMPLEMENTED

MIXED MIGRATION MANAGEMENT

€90M adopted in APRIL 2017

- ✓ Organise assisted voluntary return assistance and reintegration support in their countries of origin*
- Provide primary healthcare and emergency food to stranded migrants both at disembarkation points and in detention centres
- ✓ Provide medical assistance at disembarkation points and in detention centres
- Rehabilitate schools, hospitals, nurseries and police stations. Build water and sanitation infrastructure
- ✓ Train teachers
- Provide access to formal and non-formal education
- Establish mixed community development centres and safe spaces in alternative to detention centres

SUPPORT TO INTEGRATED BORDER AND MIGRATION MANAGEMENT

€46.3M adopted in JULY 2017

- Support both Libyan coast guards (General Administration for Coastal security under the Ministry of Interior and the Libyan Coast Guard under the Ministry of Defence) in the form of training, including on human rights, and equipment: repair of existing vessels, supply of communication and rescue equipment, rubber boats and vehicles
- Set up basic operational rooms for the coastguards in joint building in Tripoli: an interagency National Coordination Centre (NCC) and a Maritime Rescue Coordination Centre (MRCC). Complete feasibility studies for full establishment of operational rooms.
- Undertake pilot activities to increase capacity for southern border surveillance in the municipality of Ghat, after an assessment of the situation. Depending on the results of the assessment the programme provides for the set up of outposts and pilot surveillance bases, the supply of equipment, and the re-definition of procedures for rescue and treatment of migrants and fight against smuggling/trafficking in dialogue with Libyan authorities and international humanitarian actors.

STRENGTHENING PROTECTION AND RESILIENCE OF DISPLACED POPULATIONS

€5.9M adopted in DECEMBER 2017

- ✓ Increase awareness and knowledge of target groups on rights and access to basic services
- Provide assistance to migrants, including on registration and aid access, psychosocial and psychological first aid for victims of trauma and abuse
- Provide primary healthcare, water, sanitation, and hygiene services
- Distribute non-food items and hygiene kits

SUPPORTING PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN REPATRIATION AND REINTEGRATION OF VULNERABLE MIGRANTS IN LIBYA

€19.8M adopted in DECEMBER 2016

- Organise assisted voluntary return assistance and reintegration support in their countries of origin
- Provide protection support to vulnerable migrants (e.g. victims of Trafficking and Gender-Based Violence)
- Training on human rights and international standards for Libyan authorities (DCIM, Libyan Coast Guard and Port Security personnel)
- ✓ Provide medical assistance at disembarkation points and in detention centres
- Set up a Protection Fund to cover needs of migrants in detention centres and in communities
